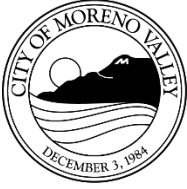

SUMMARY

The Senior Citizens' Commission shall have the general power and duty to act in an advisory capacity to the city council in all matters pertaining to senior citizens. In addition to the foregoing general power and duty, the board shall have the following particular powers and duties:

- To inform and advise the city council and city staff in matters related to individual and community senior citizen needs.
- To assist the city council and city staff in formulating policies and practices for the senior citizen center.

- To make recommendations to the city council and city staff for improving the effectiveness of senior citizen programs.
- To make recommendations to the city council and city staff on any matter affecting senior citizens.
- To advise the city council and city staff on methods of obtaining a site and funding for a permanent senior citizens' center within the city.
- To carry out such other functions as may be assigned to the board by the city council.
- It is the mission of the Senior Citizens' Commission to support and enhance the quality of life and well-being of our senior citizens by providing services, programs, and resources that promote healthy aging for greater independence within a culturally diverse and nurturing environment.

RECOMMENDATIONS SUBMITTED TO COUNCIL/DISPOSITION

Senior Center Expansion Vendor - The Public Works department recommended approving a contract with Plyco Corp. (Plyco) to complete the construction of the Moreno Valley Senior Center Expansion, Project No. 803 0057. This project expands the existing Senior Center by adding approximately 4,000 square feet of new building space on the south side of the existing building. The new expansion will be used to provide Moreno Valley seniors with additional programs, classes, events, and social activities. The construction period is scheduled to begin March 2026 and conclude in March 2027. The contract was authorized in the amount of \$5,963,451. City Council approved the authorization on December 2, 2025.

Senior Citizens' Commission Elections - In September 2025, the Commissioners voted to re-elect Hazel Lambert and Reta Butler for another fiscal year term.

Senior Community Center Additions - Through the advisory efforts of the Commission, the Senior Community Center gained restroom adjustments and additions to be serving seniors in need.

Boards & Commissions Appreciation Event - On March 11, 2026, Commissioners attended the annual Boards and Commissions Appreciation Event hosted by the City Clerk’s Office. Commissioners were recognized for their continued commitment to serving Moreno Valley’s senior community.

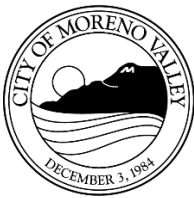

Staff recommends that the Senior Citizens Commission receive and file this program update.

SUMMARY

- Senior Center attendance March 2026: 5,096, averaging 242, (February 2026: 5,482: averaging 292)
- Senior Center membership end of March 2026: 5,784
- Meals delivered in March 2026: 2,800 meals to 400 seniors, averaging 100 seniors per week.
- Hot lunches served March 2026: 2,595, averaging 123 per day. (February 2026: 2,840 averaging 135 per day)
- FSA continues to distribute take home meals on weekends for seniors.
- Feeding America distributed (400) food boxes of non-perishable food boxes on March 12, 2026, Senior Center continues to lead the I.E. in boxes distributed to seniors. Food distribution.
- The Senior Center expansion project remains on hold. Updates will be shared as available.
- The Center will operate as a cooling center when temperatures go above 97 degrees.
- The Center's banquet room continues to average two banquet rentals a month and two church rentals every Sunday and two classroom rentals weekly.
- Healthcare agencies continue to be on site answering any healthcare questions.
- Friends continue to provide free shuttle service to seniors for all medical and grocery needs as well as free coffee.
- Haircuts continue to be full at the senior center every Tuesday. Appointment required.
- Translation headsets are available for all meetings if needed. Lead time request must be 72 hours.
- CPR classes have resumed, and the sign-up sheet is available at front counter.
