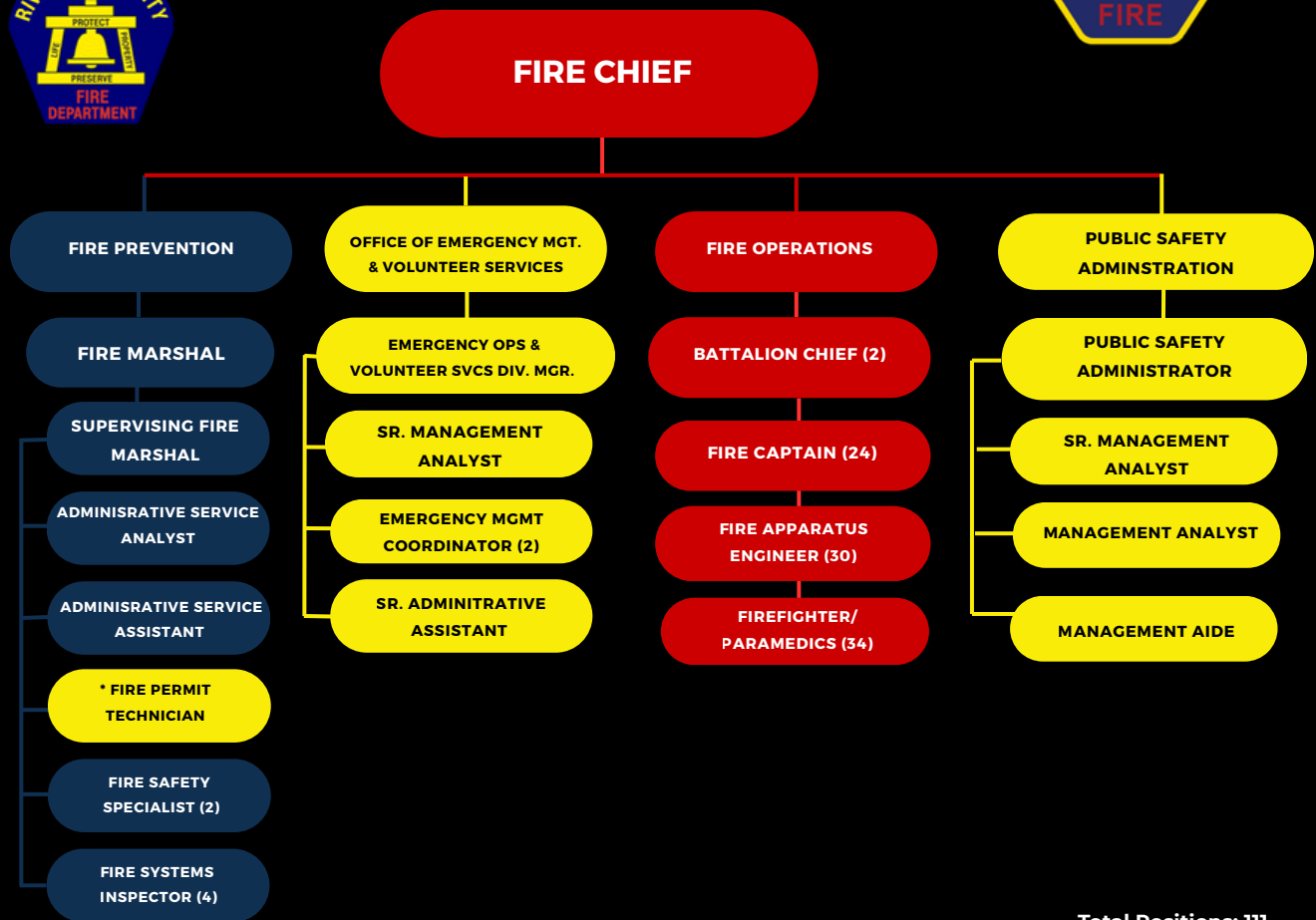

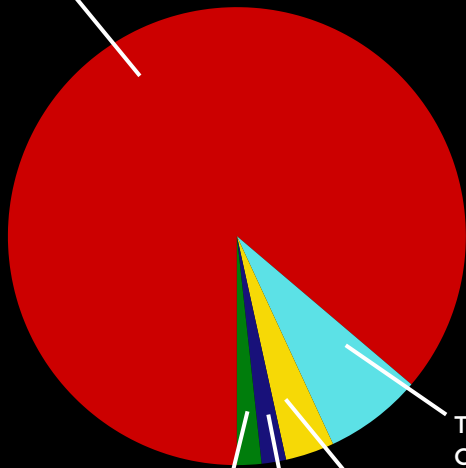

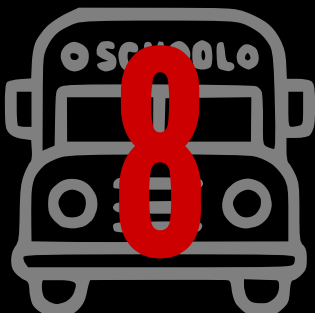

SIGNIFICANT INCIDENT

On Saturday, March 14, CAL FIRE/Riverside County Fire Department responded to reports of an inaccessible rescue involving an off-road vehicle rollover approximately one mile down a trail on Gilman Springs Rd. Crews located four victims; one had been ejected from the vehicle and was pronounced deceased at the scene. The remaining three individuals declined further medical treatment or transport. California Highway Patrol and the Riverside County Sheriff's Department are conducting the investigation. No firefighter injuries were reported.

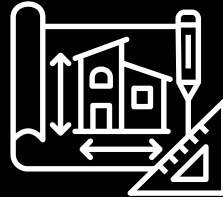

HIGHLIGHT OF THE MONTH

On Friday, March 13, CAL FIRE/Riverside County Firefighters responded to a reported pediatric drowning. Crews arrived to find Riverside County Sheriff's Deputies performing CPR on a 3-year-old who had been found submerged in a pool. Fire Department Paramedics assumed care, providing Advanced Life Support and transporting the patient to a local hospital. Thanks to these coordinated efforts, pulses were successfully regained upon arrival at the Emergency Department. The child remains in critical condition, and the outcome remains hopeful.
